

1. How to prevent articulation disorder?

- Always provide correct model for pronunciation
- If you identify a child with cleft lip and palate refer to a doctor
- Provide appropriate hearing aids as early as possible for children with hearing impairment

2. Whom to contact????

Articulation disorder

Examples of mispronunciation include 'locket' for 'rocket', 'nana' for 'banana', 'cool' for 'school' and may produce unclear speech sounds.

Acquisition of sounds by years	Order of acquisition of sounds
2-2.6 years	a, i, u, e, o, ae
2.6-3 years	p, b, m, v, th, dh, n, k, g
3-3.6 years	cha, ja
3.6 to 4 years	T, d, ya
4-4.6 years	s, sh, ing, h
6-7 years	Blends : st, sku and r, l

Features

"Thun" for 'Sun'

Substitution of sounds

"poon" for 'spoon'

Addition of sound

"i wan choki" for 'I want chocolate'

Unclear speech even after 3 years

"ool" for 'pool'

Omitting sounds

"Thal we go the exdibithon" instead of 'shall we go to exhibition'

I din't get you

"Chleep" for 'Sleep'

"Scodiver" for 'Screwdriver'

"On a eet en, I ent oo a pak" for 'on an weekend, I went to park'

Mispronunciation could be due to

Hearing impairment

Gap in lip or in roof of mouth

Tongue tie

Abnormal Oro motor Structure

Long term ear infections

Oro motor weakness

Brain damage/neurological dysfunction
